MISSION

The Mission of the Child Protection Center is to build a healthier community by leading the multidisciplinary response to the prevention, identification, and treatment of child abuse and violence.

WHAT WE DO

The Child Protection Center is a nationally accredited Child Advocacy Center, which serves Jackson, Cass and a portion of Lafayette counties in Missouri. The CPC opened in 1996 as a child-friendly, safe place for children ages 3-17, who are alleged victims of sexual or physical abuse, or who have witnessed violent crimes to provide their statement about their own experience. This statement is obtained through the forensic interview process.

In addition to forensic interviews, the CPC provides family advocacy and mental health services. Today, the CPC continues to help families begin their path toward healing.

OUR PROGRAMS

Forensic Interviews

A forensic interview is a structured conversation with a child intended to elicit detailed information about a possible event(s) that the child may have experienced or witnessed. Forensic Interviews are conducted by compassionate, highly educated and experienced Forensic Interviewers. CPC's forensic interviewers have received specialized training in forensic interviewing techniques and a solid understanding of child development. They use open-ended questions and do not lead children into talking about things that did not happen.

Family Advocacy Services

During the child's forensic interview, a Family Advocate meets with the parent or caregiver and provides:

- referrals for emergency assistance including food pantries, legal aid and other services
- referrals for specialized medical and mental health services
- education about the legal process and what to expect
- crisis intervention and support as they navigate the complex emotional, physical and legal issues that arise following a child's disclosure of abuse

Mental Health Services

The Child Protection Center offers a range of evidence-based, trauma-focused treatment services for children/teens that have completed a Forensic Interview, and for their caregivers. All of the CPC's Child and Family Therapists have a Master's degree, are licensed, or are supervised by a licensed mental health professional. Our therapy services focus on the child's feelings and behaviors that are currently causing distress, rather than continued focus on the details of the trauma. These include:

- Child & Family Traumatic Stress Intervention (CFTSI)
- Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT)
- Child-Parent Psychotherapy (CPP)
- Eye-Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR)
- Integrative Treatment for Complex Trauma (ITCT)
- The Child Protection Center provides all mental health services free of charge. To learn more about each of the trauma-focused treatments, visit cpckc.org.

Trainings

The Child Protection Center offers trainings for professionals who work in the field of child abuse or who work with children, as well as trainings for adults in the community who want to learn about how to identify and intervene in cases of child abuse.
